TIME BONUSES AT FINISH. Time bonuses will be awarded to the first three racers male and female in each USCF racing group, and to the first three racers male and female in each Competitive Citizens category to cross the finish line.

Time bonuses at finish are 15 seconds for 1st; 10 seconds for 2nd; and 5 seconds for 3rd.

**The finish line for USCF Men Pro, 1-5, Master 35-44, Master
45-54, USCF Women Pro, 1-3, Competitive Citizens and Tan-
dem is approximately 500 feet south of the entrance into the
Wyoming State Hospital.**

**At the Evanston city boundary, a Police Officer will be sta-
tioned to direct vehicles into the northbound outside traffic
lane. The inside traffic lane nearest the curb will be for rac-
ers and official race vehicles ONLY. Stay to the right of the
orange cones. Several street intersections will be barricaded
to vehicle traffic. City Police Officers and Road Marshals will
be stationed at street intersections open to vehicle traffic. Use
extreme CAUTION at these locations. The stage at the finish
line will be marked with race banners located along
the side of the Highway.**

**USCF race officials will be located on the canopied stage at
the finish line. Once you cross the finish line, you will have
approximately 500 feet to the Wyoming State Hospital en-
trance. Please turn right into this entrance.**

**A Support Station staffed by State Hospital volunteers will
be available in the grassed area adjacent to the finish line.
Water, Gatorade, fruit.**

PARKING

Parking for spectators and official race vehicles will be in desig-
nated race parking areas at the Wyoming State Hospital. Turn
right at the entrance into the State Hospital. Parking at the State
Hospital is approximately 600 to 700 feet from the finish line.
**You may not park along the side of the entrance road into
the State Hospital.** If you want to see your racer cross the fin-
ish line, make sure you are at the finish well before your racer.
Vehicle traffic coming into Evanston from the south will be
slowed or stopped to accommodate racers.

RACERS AND DRIVERS RESPONSIBILITIES

Racers must follow all USCF rules and "Rules of the Road."
Stay to the **RIGHT** of the road and **ALLOW NON-RACE
TRAFFIC TO PASS. NO DRAFTING BEHIND VEHI-
CLES. THIS IS AN IMMEDIATE DISQUALIFICATION.**
Drivers supporting racers **MAY NOT** follow race groups. Sup-
port vehicles will be identified with the number of their racer.
Feeding allowed **ONLY** at Lost Creek and North Slope Feed
Zones. Please **DO NOT LITTER.**

WHEEL IN WHEEL OUT

This means that a racer who places a wheel in a lag vehicle can
only use the wheel they put in. If you do not put a wheel in a lag
vehicle, you may **NOT** use someone else's wheel.

LIVESTOCK AND WILDLIFE

Watch for livestock such as cattle/sheep and wildlife including
deer, elk, and moose, either on or crossing the highway.

SIGNS

Signs attached to mile posts will be located approximately every
10 miles on either side of the highway from Evanston to Kamas.

The signs will read **CAUTION: BICYCLE ROAD RACE TODAY, SATURDAY, JUNE 16th.**

SNOW AND TEMPERATURE AT BALD MOUNTAIN PASS

WEATHER WATCH Be prepared for rapidly changing weather conditions. Cold weather can lead to **hypothermia**. Bring appropriate clothing. Bald Mountain Pass and the road below and above the pass may have snow along the sides of the road. The road might be wet and slippery. Temperature at the pass will be 20+ degrees cooler than at the start in Kamas. Winter weather can plague the pass.

BUS SERVICE

Buses with limited seating will be available to return racers to Kamas from the Christmas Meadows and the Wyoming State Hospital finish back to Kamas. **PLEASE SIGN UP FRIDAY P.M. OR SATURDAY A.M. First come first served.** Buses are not available to transport racers from Evanston to Kamas on Saturday morning.

People come first on the bus. If there is room, we will try to include your bike. If there is not room for your bike in Evanston, you will receive a tag for your bike which will be sheltered and guarded at the Wyoming State Hospital. Show your tag Saturday evening until 7 p.m. in order to retrieve your bike.

A lag vehicle will follow the last group to leave Kamas. Disabled racers will be transported to Evanston.

CHARLES SCRIVNER MEMORIAL TIME TRIAL

Presented by BP, Bear River Lodge, Domino's Pizza, the Evanston Lodging Tax Board, Rocky Mtn. Power, and the Uinta County Herald
(Tri-bars are permitted)

STARTING ORDER BEGINNING AT 7:30 A.M. AT 30 SECOND INTERVALS
(Does not include citizen racers)

(1) USCF Junior Men; (2) USCF Master 55+; (3) USCF Women 4 & Master 35+; (4) USCF Junior Women; (5) USCF Pro Women, 1, 2, 3;

*** 5-minute break**

(6) USCF Men 4 & 5; (7) USCF Master 45-54; (8) USCF Master 35-44; (9) USCF Men 3; and (10) USCF Pro Men, 1, 2.

The start of the Time Trial is 1.5 miles south of Phantom Fireworks on Yellow Creek Road. Look for the School District bus barn on the right hand side of the road as you are traveling south. You must park in the Bus Barn parking lot, not on the road.

Racers will ride 5 miles south along Yellow Creek Road turning around at the orange cone in the center of the road and back 5 miles to the finish. A Uinta County Deputy Sheriff will be stationed at the 5-mile turnaround. The finish line will be located on the opposite side of the road from the start. **WHEN YOU HAVE CROSSED THE FINISH LINE, DO NOT GATHER ON THE ROAD.** Please gather in the Bus Barn parking lot. A City Police Officer will be at the start/finish area to ensure traffic safety. An ambulance will be at the start/finish.

Yellow Creek Road is an open road. Property owners along the road may be traveling the road on their way to church, town or some other activity. Ride to the side of the road and be alert for vehicles entering the road from driveways. This road accesses a natural gas processing facility. On Sunday morning, there may be semi-truck tanker traffic; and/or plant shift change personnel traveling the road. **PLEASE PAY ATTENTION.** Watch for bumps, rough areas, or potholes in the road. Volunteer road marshals will be stationed along the road and at the 5-mile turnaround for traffic safety. Be alert, cautious, and courteous to adjacent landowners. There will be porta-potties at the time trial start.

STARTING ORDER BEGINNING AT 12:15 P.M. The criterium must begin shortly after 12:00 p.m. due to churches located on the criterium course. Service for these churches ends in late morning.

USCF Pro Women, 1, 2, 3 9 laps = 11.7 miles @12:15 p.m.

USCF Women 4, Master 35+ and Junior Women 8 laps = 10.4 miles @12:16 p.m.

Master 45-54 and Master 55+ Men 8 laps = 10.4 miles @12:55 p.m.

Junior Men 8 laps = 10.4 miles @12:56 p.m.

First racer to cross start/finish line on lap 4 will receive a \$20 prime. A 10 second time bonus will be awarded on lap 6 to the first racer to cross the start/finish line.

USCF Master 35-44 12 laps = 15.6 miles @ 1:35 p.m.

USCF Men 4 & 5 12 laps = 15.6 miles @ 2:25 p.m.

USCF Men 3 12 laps = 15.6 miles @ 3:10 p.m.

USCF Pro Men, 1 & 2 18 laps = 23.4 miles @ 3:55 p.m.

First racer to cross start/finish line on lap 5, will receive a \$20 prime. A 10-second time bonus will be awarded on lap 10 to the first racer to cross the start/finish line.

The first three racers to finish the final lap for the USCF Pro Men, 1 & 2 will receive time bonuses as follows: 15 seconds-1st; 10 seconds-2nd; 5 seconds-3rd.

This is a 1.3 mile closed course. The first left turn after the start begins a 6-block climb, *The Cook-Sanders Associates Hill*. A series of turns, *The Bootworks Curves* follow to 7th Street which is downhill, *The JB's Restaurants and KEVA Country/Magic 99 Downhill* with a left taken at Main Street for *The Spence Law Firm Sprint* back to the start. Alleys will be barri-

aded to vehicle traffic.

Volunteer road marshals will be stationed at ALL CROSS STREETS for traffic control. However, PLEASE BE ALERT FOR CROSS TRAFFIC OR THE POSSIBILITY OF VEHICLES MISTAKENLY ENTERING THE COURSE. A warm-up prior to the start of each heat is allowed.

There will be porta-potties in the 1st National Bank parking lot at the corner of 10th & Main Street. **Be downtown early, well before your start. Start times are approximate.**

PLEASE, NO RADIOS OR IPODS FOR ANY STAGE OF THE RACE!!

RULES OF THE ROAD LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT

Remember to stay to the right of the road and avoid bunching up when traveling along Highway 150. The "Two Abreast" rule applies for all racers.

RACER SUPPORT CREWS MAY NOT FOLLOW RACERS. You may leap frog ahead to an approved highway turn-out or parking area to cheer your racer on. Use caution when passing racers or highway traffic. **IF YOU FOLLOW YOUR RACER AND ARE IDENTIFIED BY RACE OFFICIALS, THE RACER WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.** If you pass in an unauthorized area, you risk a ticket from the Highway Patrol. Please help us keep our law enforcement officers happy.
